

Day 1 Bangkok – Samut Songkhram - Rom Hub Market - Bang Khae Yai Temple- Prok Pho Church at Bang Kung Temple – Nativity of Our Lady Cathedral at Bang Nok Kwaek - Amphawa Chai Pattananurak Project – Amphawa Floating Market - Amphawa Na Non Hotel & Spa

06.00 Depart from Bangkok to Samut Songkhram by VIP van, and it would take around 1-2 hours.

08.00 Arrived at Samut Songkhram. Then take you to Rom Hub Market or Maeklong Market, where umbrellas are spread close to the train tracks for selling. Every day, a short train runs from Mahachai Station to Mae Klong Station. When the signal of the train shows merchants will gradually pack their baskets, and umbrellas quickly, and when the train has passed It will be put back in an orderly and quickly as before. Therefore, it became the origin of the name of the Rom Hub market. which is the charm and fun of the tourists who have seen.







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Then go to worship the Buddha image at **Bang Khae Yai Temple**, an ancient temple that was built in the Ayutthaya period and restored in the reign of King Rama II by Chao Phraya Surasak (Sang Wongsarot). The important things inside the temple are the Ubosot and Wihan Khot, which enshrines 56 red stone Buddha images made of red sandstone Buddha images. It is a sculpture in the pre-Ayutthaya period. There are murals inside the monastery. The interesting is an old mural that is drawn in powder paint mixed with glue in the reign of King Rama 2 as the story of the Thai-Burmese war.

Take you to **Prok Pho Church, Bang Kung Temple**. It is an old temple in the Ayutthaya period. The highlight of Wat Bang Kung is Prok Pho Church. It is an old church that is covered with big tree roots, including Bodhi, Sai, and Krang, which holds the church to be amazing. It is considered a beautiful attraction in Samut Songkhram Province. Inside the sanctuary, enshrined Luang Pho Bot Noi or Luang Pho Nilmanee which is worshiped by the villagers and tourists.







Noon Lunch at the restaurant

Aternoon Then take you to take photos at **the Nativity of Our Lady Cathedral at Bang Nok Kwaek.** It is a catholic church that was built in the year 2490, over a hundred years old. The church is a Gothic art built with burnt bricks, and decorated with stained glass, beautiful stained glass from France. The beauty of this church is the stained glass that depicts the history of Jesus and images of important saints in the church.



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Then take you for a walk at Amphawa Chai Phatthananurak. Amphawa Project Chaipattananurak is a project that Maha Chakri Sirindhorn has a royal thought to the Office of the Chaipattana Foundation bring the land that Mr. Prayong Nakawarang gave to develop for the benefit of the Amphawa community. The area is divided into parts. The tourist attraction is the Chaipattananurak Park area. It is a traditional orchard area, integrated farming without chemicals, local plants of Amphawa are grown. Nakawaran Cultural Plaza and Chaipattananurak Park are multipurpose courtyards for organizing activities promoting local culture. The community shop of the project sells local products and Phatthapat products from the Chaipattana Foundation. Chan Chala is a beverage and snacks shop. The Chan Chala shop will be an open area connecting activities along the Amphawa Canal. Chaipattananurak Exhibition Hall is an exhibition area for cultural stories of various communities circulating by the festival and activities within the community.





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Evening Take you to **Amphawa Floating Market** located along the canal near Wat Amphawan Chetiyaram. It is also Thailand's first floating market that is open for tourists to visit until the evening. The charm of Amphawa Floating Market is the vendors who row boats selling food, and drinks such as Thai desserts, seafood, boat noodles, pad Thai, fried clams, stuffed desserts, banana desserts, and more.

Day 2 King Rama II Memorial Park—Thai Dessert Museum - Phrayayat Temple — Chulamanee Temple — Bangkok

exhibits antiques of the early Rattanakosin period, such as Benjarong wares and Khon masks. The men's room exhibits the lifestyle of brave Thai men. There are Buddha images for worship and the reclining altar which is believed to belong to Phrabat Somdej Phra Buddha Loetla Naphalai. Lady's room, showing the lifestyle of an ancient Thai woman, dressing

Morning Breakfast, At the hotel's dining room, then pack your luggage to check out from the hotel. Then take you to King Rama II Memorial Park located in Amphawa District, Samut Songkhram. The interesting thing is the Museum of King Rama II. It is a Thai-style building that inside enshrines a statue of King Rama II and



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table, Khan-Chong, terrace, exhibited in the style of an ancient Thai house decorated with wrought iron pots, and ornamental plants. The kitchen and bathroom show Thai kitchen styles with cooking utensils, cups. The outdoor theater and botanic garden is a garden of plants in various types of literature and has a shop selling local products and plants. King Rama II Memorial Park is a suitable place for visiting the Thai atmosphere.

Then take you to see the **Thai Dessert Museum**. A place to display and educate about traditional Thai desserts. The museum will replicate desserts from the Sukhothai, Ayutthaya period to the Rattanakosin period, such as Tom Daeng, Tom Khao, 9 auspicious desserts, desserts in clay pots, and provide knowledge about making Thai desserts.





Noon Lunch at the restaurant

Afternoon Take you to pay homage to the monks at **Phrayayat Temple**, or the locals call "Wat Pak Ngam", the old temple of Amphawa Floating Market that has a monk known as Luang Por Jai, the well-behaved monk of the Mae Klong Basin. Those who come to worship at this temple will get prosperity and good fortune with you.





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Then take you to pay homage to the monks before returning to Bangkok at Chulamanee Temple, an ancient temple on the banks of the Amphawa Canal, next to the Phi Lok Canal. This temple was built in the late Ayutthaya period in the reign of King Prasat Thong. Chulamanee Temple is also one of the tourist routes in the Amphawa Canal cruise and cruising routes to see fireflies. The distinctiveness of this temple is the beautiful marble porch ubosot paved with green jade

stone from the city of Karachi, Pakistan. Inside, enshrined the principal Buddha image on a

high base. The outer window is lacquered with pearl inlaid with the image of the Royal Seal from the reign of King Rama I to the present reign. Moreover, on the wall of the Ubosot, there are also elaborate murals about Buddha's history and Jataka tales. The craftsmanship of female painter Nittaya Sakcharoen, who took her time to paint for 6 years.



15.00 Take you back to Bangkok.
