Inside the building are exhibits of collectibles such as ancient coins and obsolete coins. including various banknotes. In addition, there is also a replica of a kopi shop (a coffee shop in the past), an old movie theater, etc. The military



building displays stories about soldiers. War equipment Various antique guns There are small planes and runways from World War II. The outer zone houses military-related models such as World War II fighter planes, horse carriages, etc.

Noon Lunch at the restaurant

Afernoon Take you to Tree Cups Phangnga Coffee, the upand-coming tree-top coffee shop in Phang Nga Province. Located in Khao Po Village, Krasom Subdistrict, Takua Thung District, Phang Nga, about 9 kilometers from Tham Suwan Temple, the shop is located on a large Takhian tree with a height of 17



meters, over 300 years old. Experience the natural atmosphere of lush greenery and fresh air. As well as being able to see the scenery of Phang Nga Bay in 180 degrees, then take you to Wat Tham Suwan Khuha or Wat Suwan Khuha It is an important ancient temple in Phang Nga Province. It is an interesting temple and an important historical site in Phang Nga. The location of the temple is on a mountain. which has many large and small caves. There are also many large and small caves, such as Tham Yai, Tham Jaeng, Tham Dam, Tham Kaew, Tham Phung, Tham Khrua, and Tham Bon, which is the highest cave. But most tourists prefer to pay homage to the Buddha image in the Big Cave, which is larger than the other caves. Wat Suwan Khuha has a large cave at the bottom. There are many stucco Buddha images enshrined. The most important element is the reclining Buddha statue, with a length of 72 cubits that is perfectly beautiful. Deep in the big caves are Tham Jaeng, Tham Daeng, and Tham Kaew, where you will find the beauty of stalagmites and stalactites. where tourists can walk to see this natural wonder. There is a museum that Phra Khru Winai, the abbot, has prepared around the cubicle. There are about a hundred different ancient objects. There is also the monogram of the King, and many royal families are inside the caves as well. Take you to



the Ganga Phimuk Temple, a royal temple under the Maha Nikaya Sangha Located in Takua Pa Subdistrict, Takua Pa District, Phang Nga is a provincial practice place. Organize a Brahmin ordination event in February of every month. At present, there is Phrakru Nanthapanyakon holds the position of abbot. Wat Ganga Phimuk was built on July 15,

1762, formerly known as the Ganga Temple due to the condition of the area being a floodplain. Later, in 1940, the name was changed to "Wat Ganga Phimuk" which has an archaeological site that has been registered by the Fine Arts Department in 1996, namely the southern Ubosot. Ubosot is made of bricks and mortar with, low lotus base. Inside it enshrines the Buddha image. Prince Chaofa's father There is a legend that goes on to say that in the year

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1732, Ayutthaya had a civil war. One of the royal family fled through the city of Takua Pa performed the ordination at the Ganga Phimuk Temple, and built the chapel and the principal Buddha image The people of Takua Pa were named after the creator, who was of the royal family. Somdej Chao Fah and added to being your father and having a golden main



chedi.

Then take you to walk Old Town Takuapa Located in Takuapa District, Phang Nga is a small town. charming in terms of way of life, culture, and architecture. In the tin mining era that flourished since the reign of King Rama VII, the unique identity

and charm of the old town of Takua Pa that is still preserved to the

present day is the appearance of buildings, houses, and twostory townhouses with curved arches in line colorful and beautifully decorated with strange patterns. It is in the Sino-Portuguese style of architecture. It is a perfect blend of the west and the east. In addition, Sunday evening on Sri Takuapa Road also provides a walking street in Takua Pa. Tourists will enjoy



food, local sweets, and visits to worship at the Guan Yu Shrine. Sacred things in Takuapa in the atmosphere of this small but charming cultural town.

Day 2 Phang Nga Bay Park – Sam Chong Nuea Community – Sea Turtle Conservation

Center Phang Nga Naval Base – Nang Thong Beach – Khao Lak Lighthouse

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Have breakfast at the hotel restaurant. Then take you to Phang Nga Bay **Morning**

National Park and take you to Koh Tapu, also known as Koh Tapu or Khao Tapu, located in the outer sea in the southwest of Phang Nga National Park. About 15 kilometers away, in Tambon Kalai, Takua Thung District, Phang Nga Province, it is a single island. It is shaped like a nail, and when viewed from a distance, looks like a giant nail hammered deep into the water. Sightseeing at Koh Tapu



Visitors can watch from a distance from a boat, or from the shoals of Koh Khao Phing Kan and unable to go up on the island Khao Tapu has another name that Thai people often call "James Bond Island." Khao Tapu is one of



the most famous tourist attractions in Phang Nga. Even a Hollywood movie was filmed at Koh Tapu in 1974 as the James Bond movie, The Man with the Golden Gun, and that's why it was named James Bond. The island has a nickname that tourists around the



world are well known for, Khao Tapu. Then take you to Khao Phing Kan, in the same area as Khao Tapu. Tourists will see "Khao Phing Kan", which looks like two large smooth stone slabs leaning against each other. which is caused by the sliding of rocks along the earth's



gravitational rift. The rocks at the base were eroded by sea waves, causing the top, heavy rocks to slide down and lean against each other. The back of Khao Phing Kan has a beautiful view. Looking out into the sea, you will see Khao Tapu, which stands majestically.



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Then take you to Tham Lod, a mountain that resembles Koh Talu. Small boats could pass through the other side of the cave. On the ceiling of the cave, there are strangelooking stalactites. Then take you to Hong Island, a large and small mountain complex. When sailing between the islands Look around you, like in a great hall with 2 doors and a beautiful coral reef that then leads you to Kao writes or paints. It is the way to go to Koh Panyee. Around the cliff, there are paintings depicting different kinds of animals, presumably painted by an ancient seafarer who stopped by to take shelter from the monsoons. Then take you to Koh Panyee, a small island with a flat area of about 1 rai, most of which is





located in the sea of Phang Nga Bay. and the mangrove forest area of Ao Phang Nga National Park. On Panyee Island, there are schools, football fields, health stations, mosques, and shops.



The Sea Turtle Conservation Center at Phang Nga Naval Base The 3rd Naval Area was established in 1995. The Royal Thai Navy has organized a project to conserve thousands of Andaman sea turtles. which has been given to the 3rd Navy Area to establish a sea turtle conservation center. Two sea turtle nursery points have been set up. The first area is to conserve turtle eggs in the area of Koh 1 or Koh Huyong in the Similan Islands National Park, while the second area is the sea turtle conservation area at the Sea Turtle Conservation Center. Phang Nga Naval Base, which from the conservation of sea turtle species in the past, caused a large number of sea turtles to lay their eggs and survive back to the sea. This is an indicator of the abundance of marine natural resources in the sea after 6 months when they are released back to the sea.



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Then take you to Nang Thong Beach, a completely black sand beach, quaint and uniquely beautiful. A beach with not much space

There is fine black sand that is as beautiful as the white sand beach. The pitch-black that happens is not dirty. But it is a substance made of tin that is present in the



Takuapa city area. A land that, in the past, was the most prosperous mining industry in Thailand by panning minerals in the past, there is

a part of the sparse mineral that comes from the sifting process called slag. The villagers then



panned these sparse mineral slags. became part of the sand until it became a black sand beach as seen today

Then take you to Khao Lak Lighthouse, located nearby

Nang Thong Beach, Khuk Khak Subdistrict, Takuapa

District, Phang Nga Province. This is as an important landmark of Nang Rong Beach. Because this lighthouse was built after the tsunami sure enough. for warning when

turtle conservation tradition. by releasing turtles into the sea which is held continuously every year Then take you to Tha Sai Temple, Thai Mueang, located at Ban Tha Taeng, Na Toei Subdistrict, Thai Mueang District, Phang Nga. beautiful teak In the sea at Tha Sai beach, in the midst of a shady atmosphere The teakwood church of Wat Tha Sai is a Thai-style building. Especially the window panes are characterized by delicate carvings. One side is now open to see the sea. The external structure is replicated from Phra Ubosot Phra Aranyawat, Tha Bo District, Nong Khai to be built with wood. The bouquet of the church is carved by Chiang Mai craftsmen. Inside the teak church, the walls are covered. With the chairman's altar, The upper floor enshrines a Buddha image in the attitude of preaching, carved from white jade stone and influenced by Indian art. It has a lap width of about 55 inches and a height of 2.15 meters.

There is a beautiful, delicate Buddha image filled with faith. Around the ordination hall, there is a wooden glass wall. Bai Sema is carved from white jade stone with a Buddha image in the middle. At the entrance to the church, decorated with golden Asoke pillars The





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teakwood church of Wat Tha Sai has another unique feature: it is decorated with wood. carved with exquisite craftsmanship from Ayutthaya. Both around the door, window, and gable, is a story about the history of the Buddha's history 10, which is a high-ranking asceticism.
