

PHRAE



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Day 1 Bangkok– Phrae – Prathat Cho Hae Temple - Phae Mueang Phi Nation Park - Khum Wong Buri -
Khum Chao Luang

02.00 Depart from Bangkok to Phrae would take around 8 hours.

10.00 Arrive at **Phrae**. Then take you to **Prathat Cho Hae Temple**, an old holy temple in Phrae province. It is a Prathat temple of the year of birth of those born in the tiger

year. Anyone who has come to travel at Phrae

must come to worship Prathat Cho Hae to be

auspicious with oneself. It is said that if you come

to Phrae, but you don't come to worship Prathat

Cho Hae as you didn't come. It is a temple located

on a low hill about 28 meters high. Prathat Cho

Hae is a chedi of Chiang Saen Art. Its octagonal design, twelve wooden recessed corners lined

with golden flowers, zucchini, or thong Jango. The relic is high 33 meters, rectangular base,

wide 11 meters on each side. The appearance of the relics is located on a square base of 1

layer, the base is a 3-layer octagonal board, next to it is a lotus base and a set of octagonal

wooden bottoms stacked up to 7 layers, then a bell lotus 1 layer and one layer of board to the

octagonal bell body. Next up are the Twelve Wood Throne and Pong Chanhai. As for the top,

decorated in Lanna style, there are iron fences around the Buddha image in 4 directions, and

there are 4 doors each door has created a beautiful Lanna castle arch.



Noon Lunch at the restaurant.

Afternoon Take you to **Phae Mueang Phi Nation Park**. It came from the topography,

which is the soil and sandstone was naturally

eroded into various shapes. Phae means grove, and

Mueang Phi means loneliness. It was established as

a nation park on March 4, 1981, with an area of

167 rai. It is a beautiful place in terms of geology,

cliffs, soil pillars, and nature trails in Phae Mueang



Phi Nation Park. Make a study path nature to serve students and general tourists who have

come to study the condition of the forest and geological features to promote knowledge and a

greater understanding of the conditions of the forest park area. Continue to **Khum Wong Buri**

or Ban Wong Buri, a striking pink building,

over 100 years old, located on Kham Lue

Road, Mueang District, Phrae Province.

Khum Wong Buri was built according to the

initiative of Mae Chao Bua Tha. She was the

first wife in Chao Luang Phiriyathepwoong, the last ruler of Phrae. It is a gift for the marriage

between Chao Sunanta daughter of Chao Burirat and Luang Pong Phibun. This Khum is a

light pink Thai-European-style building, which is the favorite color of Mae Chao Bua Tha. It



is a large 2-floors golden teak house in Thai-Lanna style mixed with European style. It decorated with decorative patterns with fretwork known as “gingerbread” patterns as popular in the reign of King Rama V, which were beautifully built all over the building such as the gable, roof ridge, water vents, wind vents, window frames above the doors and windows, balconies, inside the building, there are plant patterns and vines, etc. The foundations of the building are large logs, and bricks are poured over them. Khum Wong Buri consists of interesting rooms, there are Chao Bua Tha's room, living room, and bedroom, which each room has various appliances such as cabinets, beds, tables, chairs, dressing tables, cups, bowls, silverware, iron cleats, ancient weapons, ancient Buddha images in the Chiang Saen period, U Thong, and various old pictures that decorate the story of this house. Then take you to **Khum Chao Luang**. This Khum is a splendid building. There are a total of 72 doors and windows, beautifully decorated with wood fretwork patterns on top of the wind and water eaves. It is the architecture of the early King Rama V era, which has the shape of Thai-European architecture or gingerbread that was popular in those days. The thatched roof built from “Mai Pan Kled” does not have a pediment as a hipped roof with a rectangular porch protruding. In front of the building, the porch roof has a triangular shape. The gable end and the water eaves around the building are decorated with beautifully carved wooden patterns by a famous Chinese craftsman. The building originally had stairs going up and down on the north and south sides. Currently dismantled, only the stairs are left up and down at the front

and back. The building is made of brick and mortar, has 2 floors, does not have piles, but uses logs. Most of them are heartwood, redwood, and

hardwood that support the entire pillar base under the building, which is about 2 meters above the ground.

This Khum Chao Luang was used as the residence of His Majesty and Her Majesty, when they came to visit

the people of Phrae on 15 to 17 March 1958. It

received an award from Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn as an outstanding architecture in the category of institutional and public buildings.



Evening **Dinner at the restaurant.**

19.00 Take you to check-in at **Phrae Nakara Hotel** or a hotel of the same level for leisure time.

Day 2 Phra Bat Ming Mueang Temple - Phrae City Pillar Shrine - Fai Folk Museum - Pratubjai House - Kad Kong Kao

Morning **Breakfast at hotel's dining room.** Take you to **Phra Bat Ming Mueang Temple**. It is located on Charoen Muang Road, Mueang Phrae District, Phrae Province. It used to be a Rat temple. Later in 1955, it



received royal permission to raise it as Wat Phrabat Ming Mueang. It is a third-class royal monastery of the type Worawihan. Wat Phra Bat Ming Mueang is from two temples

combined, Wat Phra Bat and Wat Ming Mueang. Wat Phra Bat is the temple of Phraya

Viceroy or Chao Hor Na. Wat Ming Muang is the temple of the ruler of Phrae. When the city



of Phrae was abolished the rulership system,

both temples were abandoned in a state of

great disrepair. Even the provincial

department deems it appropriate to merge

the two temples and named it Wat Phrabat

Ming Mueang. Then take you to **Phrae City Pillar Shrine**. This new City Pillar Shrine is

built with Lanna art, lacquered and gilded. It consists of large teak pillars embedded in the

cement wall. Looking from the outside, it looks elegant and suitable as the main treatment

place of the city. The inscription that was originally used as a city pillar is still located at the

back of the newly built city pillar in the City Pillar Shrine. If anyone has visited the city of

Phrae, try to pay homage to the blessings for the prosperity of the journey. Let this City Pillar

Shrine be the starting point for a trip to Phrae City.

Noon

Lunch at the restaurant.

Afternoon Take you to [Fai Folk Museum](#). It is a place to simulate life in the form

of a house and household items of the townspeople more than 100 years ago. Get to know the way of life of Phrae in the past, and a simulation of the ancient way of life that can be seen as difficult at present. House building model, household items of Phrae people



such as tricycles, crockery, cabinets, jars, agricultural tools, fishing tools, etc. Then

take you to [Pratubjai House](#). There are collectibles, antiques such as antique vases,



old money, large wood carvings, record player, old money showcase, Chinese pattern vase wood carving.

The highlight of this house is the large teak pillars

located in the space under the house. There are as

many as 130 pillars carved on the base of the pillars in the shape of elephants and trees.

Currently, plaster is poured on the ground and the pillars to maintain the wood from decaying with moisture.

Evening Take you to [Kad Kong Kao](#) or Phrae Walking Street, located on Kham Lue

Road, near Ban Wong Buri and Wat Pong Sunan. This road is a residential area that is still old buildings with 2 adjacent kads, the old

kad Kong and the reclining kad. Tourists can park around Ban Wong

Buri and walk around to see both Kad at the same time. It is

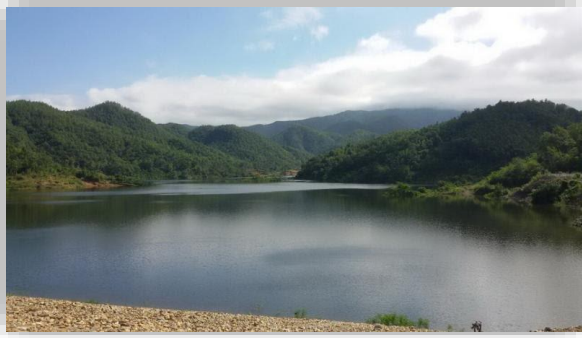


organized to be a trading area for local products and recreational activities for people in the community. It is a meeting place for the people of Phrae. **Have dinner at your leisure.**

19.00 Back to the heotel for leisure time.

Day 3 Mae Sai Reservoir - Phrathat Doi Leng - Bangkok

Morning **Breakfast at hotel's dining room.** Pack your bags to check out from the hotel.



Then take you to **Mae Sai Reservoir**. It is one of the royal projects. It is an earthen dam, 32 meters high, 245 meters long, 8 meters wide, is a reservoir for raw water for agricultural use in

Mueang District and Sung Men District.

It is also used as a source of water to produce tap water for sanitation. It is suitable for exploring the atmosphere on the dam ridge with mountains

that surround the water surface is very beautiful. Then

take you to **Phrathat Doi Leng**. It is another important sanctuary of Phrae province, located on a high mountain in the southeast of Phrathat Cho Hae. The construction of the Prathat is unidentified for sure that it was built in

any year. Because of the landscape on a high mountain, showing views of the city of Phrae,



which is surrounded by mountains and the forest beautifully in the morning. There is another viewpoint that can see Phra That Cho Hae, shining brass pagoda that not far away which Phrae province has prepared a viewpoint located before the stairs leading up to the temple can watch the sunrise and the mist beautifully, and pay homage to the relics to be auspicious.

Noon Lunch at the restaurant. Then depart from Phrae to Bangkok would take around 8 hours.

21.00 Arrive at Bangkok safely.
