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

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PANDEMIC GRADUATION

ABGTS-PHILIPPINES

The previous year and the current year have proven to be difficult years for many seminaries around the world due to COVID-19. The brunt of the pandemic forced many seminaries to shut down their operations, at least temporarily until they can figure out the best way on how to handle their situation. ABGTS-Philippine ALC was not spared from the onslaught of the pandemic. Since the lockdown was enforced last year (March 15, 2020 to be exact), ABGTS-

Philippine ALC received no new students. However, despite the challenges brought about by the pandemic, by the grace of God, ABGTS-Philippine ALC managed to keep its operation going. Last March, five of its students graduated, four with a ThM and one with a ThD. (Since the local government did not allow mass gatherings, ABGTS held a virtual graduation.) In addition, eight made successful defenses of their proposals. It also continues to provide scholarships to deserving students—thanks to Dr. Soon Tae Kwon for his kindness and untiring efforts in raising scholarships for ABGTS students. To date, the professors and the students continue to meet face-to-face in the seminar room, although some of them were forced to incorporate the inevitable—online learning, or at least the so-called "blended learning," a combination of face-to-face learning and synchronous online learning. ABGTS has to adapt to

the changing situation. Whether online learning is now the new face of learning remains to be seen. In any case—and God willing—ABGTS-Philippine ALC is ready to adapt to the challenges caused by the pandemic.

ABGTS-THAILAND

Since the Corona

in Vietnam, where they have extension program for ABGTS. Students are struggling with the pandemic and they are involved mostly these days taking care of their church and members. Given the uncertain pandemic situation, the ALC plan to conduct online seminars soon.

Meanwhile the ongoing campus development and building construction project of the Seminary has stopped. The country has oftentimes experience lockdowns due to the surge of COVID-19 cases. The project is sourced by the ABGTS – G. Wilson Theological Education Development Program. This Endowment, aimed to support faculty and seminary development, is still being fund raised continually.

LEARNING DURING A **PANDEMIC**

Some months ago, an irate barangay (village) officer stopped a food delivery rider from entering the border as a violation of curfew. The reason, which has gained notoriety, was that his delivery of lugaw, (rice porridge) was "not essential". The rider argued that food, like lugaw was actually part of essential goods to be allowed during curfew. The officer, unfazed, responded that it was not, since people can live without lugaw. Amused and angry netizens who saw the video, began the hashtag #lugawisessential.

On October 22, 1939 in Oxford, England, C.S. Lewis delivered a sermon entitled "Learning in Wartime". In it, Lewis reflects on why as students in Oxford should they continue study and research within their own fields, while World War 2 raged in continental Europe. Should not their lives be suspended and fully preoccupied by war?

Lewis says, "We have to inquire whether there is really any legitimate place for the activities of the scholar in a world such as this." Lewis is asking, is learning, like the famed *lugaw*, essential?

Lewis's experience of the onset of WWII and the COVID pandemic has its own parallels. The massive upheaval this pandemic has created on a global scale, often times makes us uneasy of the future. Are intellectual pursuits worth it or even sustainable, both economically and psychologically, especially in our volatile Filipino context? Should study and research still preoccupy us in the midst of this plague?

Lewis makes the point that the war, although significant is not ultimate. Lewis noticed that during his time in the frontline trenches of World War I, the more people were in the thick of the battle, the less people were even talking about it. Lewis says, "The war will fail to absorb our whole attention because it is a finite object, and therefore intrinsically unfitted to support the whole attention of a human soul."

The COVID pandemic, likewise, though significant for our time, but from the long perspective of history is just another aggravation to the human story, such as Lewis's own WWI and II. This of course does not mean that we should be detached from the urgent demands of the pandemic. We should be fully present and fully engaged. However, so as not to fall into despair, we need to be paradoxical in our imagination. We must be fully present and yet, acknowledge that a future, full of

hope in Christ still holds a promise for us.

So while the pandemic continues on, as a sign of our hope promised by Christ, one continues on the activities of study and research. God, as Lewis affirms, does not give this appetite for learning in vain. Learning as a vocation from God, has its own mysterious relevance, especially in the age of social media and misinformation.

A life given to study, engaging with seemingly trivial details and arguments, disciplines the human soul and readies us to engage the crises of the present day and the work of the future. It is part of our human and humanizing work in this dehumanizing time. Thus to continue on studying despite the psychological and economic pressures, signifies a courageous "YES!" to Christ's future hope in the midst of crisis of the present.
