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## Procedure

0	Politely introduce yourself/ask the patient's name, give reasons and ask permission for a physical examination.
1	Briefly describe the patient what to do.
2	Check the vital sign / see the recorded vital sign
3	Examine the external ear, the appearance of the auricle, is the ear canal normal? Press on the tragus, does it hurt?
4	Do the otoscope have to be examined in both ears, is the eardrum intact or not, is the outer ear red, is there pus/wax obstruction? Does the middle ear have middle ear effusion? Do valsava to look at the eardrum.
5	Check tuning fork weber test rinne test interpret results
6	additional examination said to examine the back of the nasal cavity See if there is a lump behind the nasal cavity. Check the balance system/neurosystem cerebellar tandem gait Romberg finger to nose/heel to knee
